Performer & Parent Information

Accompanists

It is the responsibility of the competitor to make arrangements with an accompanist. A list of these can be found at http://armidale-eisteddfod.org.au/accompanists/

Dress Code

It is in a competitor's own interest to pay special attention to dress and presentation when performing. These make up part of the performance and may be taken into consideration by the adjudicator.

Supervision

The Eisteddfod is privileged to have access to the Old Teachers' College, the Hoskins Centre at TAS and Lazenby Hall at UNE, and asks parents and teachers to supervise students and children at all times.

Turn up for your event at the beginning of the session.

Many problems are caused by performers turning up late. The Eisteddfod Committee will ensure that sessions start on time but cannot guarantee starting times for individual events.

For all events, music or scripts for the adjudicator must be handed to the Music/Script Supervisor 30 minutes prior to the start of the session. If not made available, the competitor may be disqualified.

If performing **multiple pieces** from memory from the **same original book**, please supply photocopies of the individual pieces, to enable them to be filed in separate event folders for the Adjudicator.

Rules of Competition

1. Definitions

- 1.1 For the purposes of the Eisteddfod, a competitor's age shall mean their age on the advertised opening date of the Eisteddfod. Competitors in age-limited events must be prepared to submit proof of age by Birth Certificate or other means if required to do so.
- 1.2 **Open** means the event is open to all competitors of any age, provided that they are 'amateur performers', that is, 'not professional'. This means not deriving a significant proportion of his/her total annual income from teaching or performing in that field, or having been employed in that field for the previous ten years.
- 1.3 *Restricted* events are open only to competitors who have not won a solo event for that category of instrument or speech and drama in a previous eisteddfod at Armidale or elsewhere.
- 1.4 **Novice** events are open only to competitors who have been learning that category of instrument (including voice) for 18 months or less prior to close of entries.
- 1.5 **Small country school** events are open only to school groups from schools outside Armidale having a school population of fewer than 100 pupils.
- 1.6 **School groups** must consist only of members of that school.

2. Before an Event

- 2.1 Music or scripts for the Adjudicator must be handed to the Music/Script Coordinator at least 15 minutes before the start of the event. Competitors who fail to do so may be disqualified.
- 2.2 Competitors must fill out the Copyright Declaration form ONCE for the whole Eisteddfod. The form is available through the main menu of the Eisteddfod website. The completed form must be handed in prior to a competitor's first event.
- 2.3 The TITLE, COMPOSER/AUTHOR and the COMPETITOR'S NAME, EVENT NUMBER and COMPETITOR'S NUMBER must be clearly visible on the music or script.

3. Conditions of entry

- 3.1 A competitor may enter a particular solo event twice provided a different instrument is played for each performance (e.g. trumpet, trombone).
- 3.2 Unless stated otherwise the competitor shall select pieces to be performed.
- 3.3 A competitor shall not perform the same item in more than one event during the Eisteddfod.
- 3.4 A competitor must not repeat any item performed in a previous Armidale Eisteddfod until three years have passed.
- 3.5 Where events refer to an AMEB Grade (or equivalent) it is presumed that the competitor is currently playing at that standard. It is not intended that a competitor play a piece at a lower level than their current standard. Notwithstanding the above, a competitor MAY play a piece at a higher level than their current standard.
- 3.6 The Committee reserves the right to cancel or combine any event where insufficient entries are received.
- 3.7 All special requests must be made at the time of entry.
- 3.8 The order of events may be changed at the discretion of the Committee or Coordinator.
- 3.9 The order of competitors within an event may be changed at the discretion of the Committee or Coordinator.

- 3.10 Competitors not answering their names when it is their turn to perform in an event may be disqualified.
- 3.11 Under special circumstances, the Coordinator may allow a competitor to perform out of the event. He or she will receive adjudication but no placing.
- 3.12 It is the responsibility of the competitor to make arrangements with an accompanist at least three weeks prior to the performance, and to negotiate fees with the accompanist.
- 3.13 In any championship event there must be at least 4 entries, of whom at least 3 must perform for the event to run. If only 1 or 2 of the entrants turn up they may perform but will only receive adjudication, with no prize money or placing.

Likewise, non-championship events will require at least 3 contestants to perform for prize money to be awarded.

3.14 Prize money is payable by EFT. Winners are requested to supply their bank details no later than one month after winning a cash prize. Cash prizes need to be finalised no later than 31st July 2024 or may be forfeited. It is the applicant and entrant's responsibility to ensure that all banking information provided is accurate. AES will not accept responsibility for any effect arising from incorrect or mistaken bank details.

4. Duet and Trio Events

- 4.1 In duet or trio items the names of the individual partners must be stated on the entry form. In the event of one partner being unable to perform due to a genuine change in circumstance, the Committee may allow a substitute provided that notice is given to the Entry Coordinator before the start of the session.
- 4.2 An individual may enter a duet or trio event with different partners and/or different instruments. The maximum number of times an individual can enter the same duet or trio event is two.

5. Time Limits

- 5.1 Where there is no stated time limit, the adjudicator reserves the right to terminate a competitor's performance at any stage. This does not mean disqualification or disapproval.
- 5.2 Time limits in all events must be strictly observed. A warning bell may be rung when the time limit is reached. A further bell may be rung 15 seconds after the finishing time. At this point the competitor must leave the stage.

6. Speech & Drama Specific Rules

- 6.1 Conductors must not sing or speak when conducting choral speech, choral singing or instrumental groups. In speech and drama events, teachers are not to prompt, direct or coach behind stage.
- 6.2 All props for Speech and Drama events are to be provided by competitors. There will be no specialist lighting and lighting is limited to on and blackout.
- 6.3 A competitor is permitted to use another person (other than his/her teacher) as prompt, if necessary, in the following Speech and Drama events:
 - Solo character sketch
 - Dramatic extract or short play
 - Verse speaking
 - Prose recital
 - Humorous prose or verse

Prompts must have their own copies of the scripts and be seated inconspicuously to the left or right of the performing space. Prompting will result in lower marks.

7. Music Events

- 7.1 Unless performing from memory, all competitors must perform from the original copy.
- 7.2 If performing from memory, the original music must be handed to the Music Coordinator to be passed on to the adjudicator.
- 7.3 If a photocopy is required for the adjudicator or accompanist, the original music must still be shown to the Music Coordinator. The Copyright Declaration Form must be completed.

8. Judging and Disputes

- 8.1 The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 8.2 If a satisfactory standard is not achieved, the award of first or any place will be left to the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 8.3 Where equal places are awarded any prizes for that place are to be shared between award winners.
- 8.4 The Adjudicator has the authority of the Committee to terminate a performance if it is considered offensive in any way.
- 8.5 Any person who is related to or has been taught or coached privately by an appointed Adjudicator during the 12 months preceding the opening date of the Eisteddfod will not be in contention for a prize or placing and will be eligible for 'comments only'.
- 8.6 Communication with the Adjudicator by competitors, teachers or other interested parties is strictly forbidden. All enquiries must be made to the Eisteddfod Coordinator. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.
- 8.7 All protests must be in writing and lodged with the Eisteddfod Coordinator within one hour of the conclusion of the session containing the item to which the protest relates.
- 8.8 The Committee shall be the sole judge of disputes and its decision shall be final.

9. Recording of Performances and Publicity

- 9.1 The use of cameras or recording devices at our venues and events is prohibited. However, parents may take still images of their own children performing in Solo sections without the use of flash and providing it does not interfere with the performance or audience participation.
- 9.2 All electronic devices should either be turned off or on Silent mode.
- 9.3 AES may publicise the name, profile and photograph of an entrant in Eisteddfod publications and results, via electronic, social and printed media at its discretion.

Copyright

Rules

- Competitors are responsible for complying with the Australian Copyright Act, 1968, including laws relating to arranging, photocopying and the use of recorded music. See the One Music Guide to Music in Eisteddfods for more information and to ensure you are meeting your copyright obligations: onemusic.com.au
- 2. The Armidale Eisteddfod Society accepts no responsibility for copyright infringement by competitors.
- 3. Competitors and/or accompanists must use original published editions of music or authorised copies. Where photocopies are used for a performance they must be accompanied by a letter from the publisher or copyright holder. Schools may use AMCOS-stamped copies in accordance with AMCOS agreement.
- 4. The OneMusic Copyright Declaration Form will be available at the eisteddfod venues and is available online. The competitor, parent, guardian or teacher may complete this form.
- 5. A copy of work (music or printed word) must be provided for the adjudicator.
- 6. Photocopies made for adjudication purposes will be destroyed after the event by the Eisteddfod Committee.
- 7. Recordings of music used by competitors must be original, legally purchased and/or clearly endorsed with an AMCOS license number.
- 8. Making recordings of eisteddfod performances (unless expressly forbidden during a session due to child protection or for another reasons) may be for your personal and domestic use only. Any further copying or sharing requires a Domestic Use Video Licence from AMCOS. Further information is available by emailing nonretlic@apra.com.au.

Instructions

- 1. The OneMusic Copyright Declaration Form needs to be completed once for the whole Eisteddfod and is to be handed in at a competitor's first performance and filed.
- 2. Prior to each event, all competitors must be able to show the Music/Script Coordinator the original music or script from which photocopies for adjudication purposes have been made.
- 3. Failure to produce the original may result in disqualification.

Speech and Drama Events

- 1. An exception (Section 45) in the Copyright Act permits a reading or recitation in public of an extract of reasonable length from a published literary or dramatic work, or from an adaption, if the work is sufficiently acknowledged.
- 2. You may photocopy a work or edition that is protected by copyright for use in the Eisteddfod. The Eisteddfod Committee destroys all photocopies after the event. You are not required to complete any forms.

In all your dealings with the Eisteddfod remember that most of the work is done by volunteers. If you feel the Eisteddfod could be improved, we encourage your constructive suggestions or, better still, your involvement.



Short-listed composers for each event will be informed by telephone or via their music teacher. They will be requested to attend the Composition Awards Night and make arrangements for performing their piece. Only compositions which are performed live will be considered for a place. A Highly Commended Award will be presented to all compositions presented by recording. Competitors should take this rule into consideration when composing their piece.

At the conclusion of the Workshop, the Elena Kats-Chernin Prize (framed music) for best overall composition will be announced. The winner is selected by the adjudicator from all First prize winners across events MC01 to MC08.

Adjudicator: PETER DART

Peter Dart is a clarinettist, a composer and a music educator with a Doctor of Philosophy in



music from the University of Queensland. Professionally he has played clarinet with the major orchestras in Sydney and Brisbane, and was Head of Music At Trinity Grammar School, Sydney, for 12 years. In 2022, Toccata Classics in London released a CD of his compositions, which was listed by Primephonic (now part of Apple) among its top new releases. Currently Peter holds the position of Coordinator of the Composition program at the Conservatorium High School in Sydney. Here he works and shares his inspiration with some of the most gifted aspiring young musicians in Australia.

In 1965, he gained a place at the high school of the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. After one hearing of a Hindemith string quartet, he decided that he would start composing.

At the age of 14 he began composition lessons Richard Meale. He later studied with Peter Sculthorpe and Don Banks, and had works performed at ISCM Concerts in Sydney and Perth.

From the late 1970s, he worked in concert and opera orchestras in Sydney, such as the AOBO and the SSO, and in Brisbane in the Queensland Theatre Orchestra. In Brisbane, in the mid-1980s, he began to study composition with Georg Tintner, a Viennese conductor and composer who had studied with Felix Weingartner and Joseph Marx. These lessons were highly disciplined in melody and counterpoint. Whilst working at Trinity Grammar Peter wrote music regularly for school productions. Since leaving Trinity he has focused on chamber music and song writing, and still has a yearning for more musical discovery.

Adjudicator: WENDY LORENZ



Wendy Lorenz has enjoyed an active career as both pianist and teacher, performing extensively throughout Australia and overseas and appearing for many major radio and television networks in Europe and Asia. A 'Student of the Year' graduate of the Sydney Conservatorium and Beethoven Bicentenary Medallion recipient (awarded internationally by the West German Government), she has also belonged to a number of notable chamber ensembles including the highly acclaimed New England Ensemble, Australian Piano Trio, Young Sydney Piano Trio, Phoenix Ensemble and Lanyon Trio. In the solo realm she has appeared as concerto soloist with many of Australia's leading orchestras including commercial

releases with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra, the Queensland Symphony Orchestra and the Slovak Radio Symphony Orchestra.

Also active as a music educator, she has taught at the NSW Conservatorium, the Australian National University and the Universities of New England and Southern Queensland, where she was also Head of Music from 2000 to 2004 inclusive. She has presented workshops, masterclasses and piano teaching seminars throughout Australia and overseas, (with guest residencies in China, Singapore, Malaysia and the USA).

A current member and past National Chair of the Australasian Piano Pedagogy Conference Committee, she is also a Federal Examiner for the Australian Music Examinations Board and Artistic Director of the prestigious Australian National Piano Award. Wendy recently relocated to the southern Gold Coast from where she continues her teaching, examining, adjudicating and consulting activities.







Born in Sydney, Nicole Hammill attended the Conservatorium High School, and then travelled to the USA on scholarship, attaining three degrees in violin performance, including an MMus with High Distinction from Indiana University and a DMA from Louisiana State University. She subsequently lectured at Southeastern Louisiana and West Virginia Universities before returning to Australia for the violin lectureship at James Cook University in Townsville.

In 1999, she relocated to Brisbane, where she lived for almost 20 years, performing with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra as soloist, Concertmaster and Principal First Violin, and was a sessional lecturer at the Queensland Conservatorium, as well as at QUT and USQ.

From 2018 to 2023, she was Head of Strings at the Mitchell Conservatorium in Bathurst, and re-established the Bathurst Chamber Orchestra, performing as Leader and Director. Nicole undertook brief teaching appointments in Orange and Armidale also, before re-locating in 2023 to Moss Vale in the Southern Highlands. She currently performs with the Canberra Symphony Orchestra, and this year, with the Sydney Philharmonia Orchestra.



Jason Noble is one of Australia's most versatile clarinettists (experimental to classical), a soloist and core member of Ensemble Offspring. Jason has performed at festivals locally and internationally, from Warsaw to London, Shanghai to Kabul, and all major cities across Australia. "His expertise and virtuosic playing give new insights into the versatility of the bass clarinet" (Sounds Like Sydney).

His album releases include THRUM (2020) (a collection of improvised ambient sounds created with Kim Cunio on piano) and Chi's Cakewalk (2017), an album of new Australian works for clarinets. He has also made guest

appearances on albums for Gurrumul, Sally Seltmann, ABC Classics, Gondwana Voices, Paul Mac, Halcyon, SICKO improvising orchestra, and the Tiwi women's choir Ngarukuruwala. Recently he performed at the Adelaide Festival in Incredible Floridas, curated by Kim Williams, appearing as soloist with the Australian String Quartet.

Jason collaborates with experienced and emerging composers, and is an in-demand music educator and examiner. He has been invited to teach two winter academies at the Afghanistan National Institute of Music in Kabul, and maintains links with staff and students there.
